



The Great Write Away is a 7 day writer's retreat developed by writers, for writers.


We've broken story telling into 7 bite sized pieces, which we teach over 7 days (or take your time and learn from home).



Uniquely she has been a finalist in all three categories at the NZ Book Awards, for fiction, non-fiction and poetry.



Introducing Nikki Crutchley












Nikki has been a freelance proof-reader – but crime/thriller/mystery novels are here passion.




