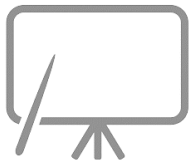

The Great Write Away is a 7 day writer's retreat developed by writers, for writers.

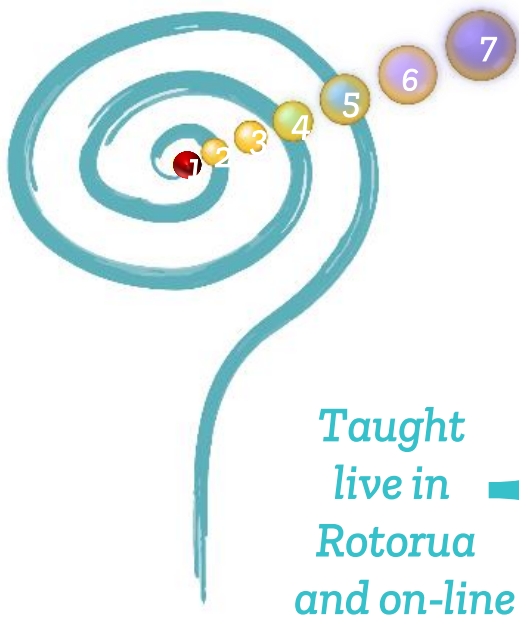
We've broken story telling into 7 bite sized pieces, which we teach over 7 days (or take your time and learn from home).

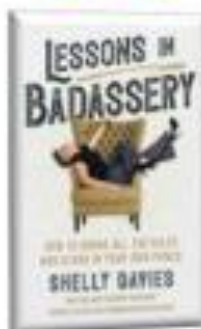


Shelly Davies has been described as the love-child of Brené Brown and P!nk!

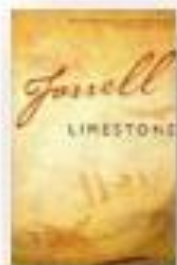
Introducing Fiona Farrell

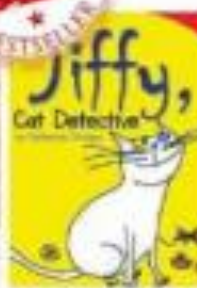

An experienced tutor and master story teller, Catherine will share her experience writing historical fiction/non-fiction and explain how you can bring power to objects in storytelling.

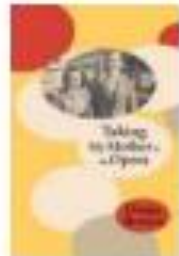


Introducing Diane Brown

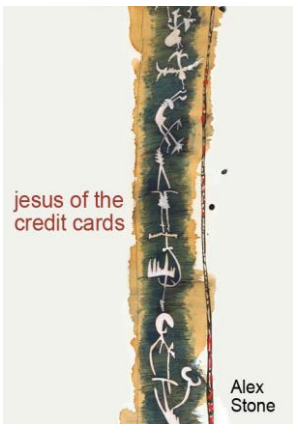
Introducing Alex Stone

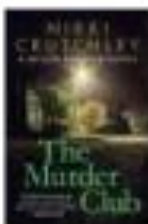

Introducing Jessica Newman

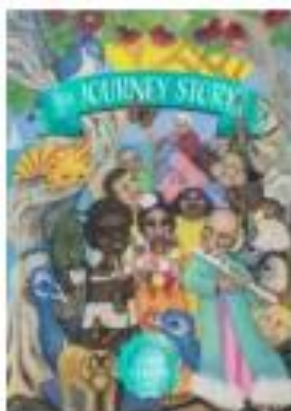


Jessica's first passion is painting. She likes making all sorts of Art...Art that is funny, beautiful, thought provoking, escapist and relevant!

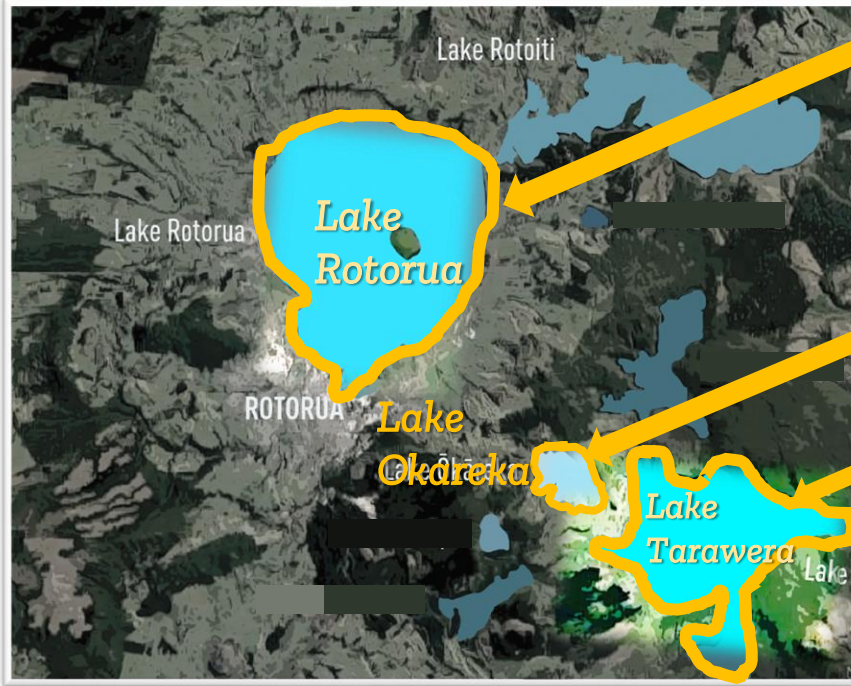

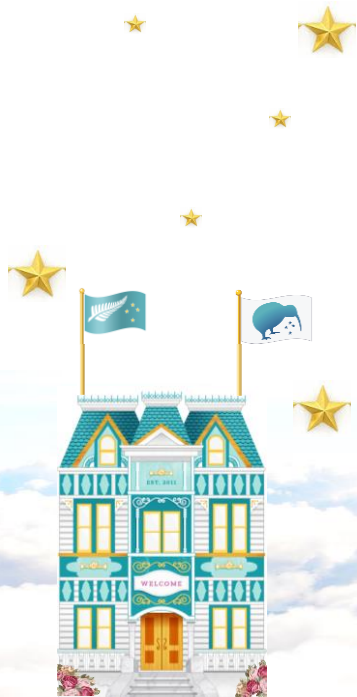
